# Illinois Soldiers and Sailors Home,

William Matthews, of the Town of Lincoln, in the County of Logan, and State of Illinois, formerly a Soldier of the United States of America, in the war against <sup>(\*)</sup> the late Rebellion, respectfully asks that he be admitted as a member of said Home.

To enable the authorities to determine whether or not he is legally entitled to become a member of said Home, he declares and states the facts to be that he is now 51 years old; that he is 5 feet and 8 inches high; that he is of Light complexion, Blue eyes, and Black hair; that he was born in the town of Marysville in the State of Ohio on the 18th day of June, 1847; that he has been <sup>(2)</sup> enrolled in the U. S. A. service; once in the war against Mexico, and once in the war of the late Rebellion; and that he has been <sup>(4)</sup> once honorably discharged from the service of the United States. That the following is a true statement of the time and place of his enrollment, and discharge from said service, and of the cause of his discharge, and of his rank at the respective date thereof, namely:

That he now receives, on pension certificate number 93523, a pension of 12 dollars a month payable the 11th day of next Jan, at the Chicago Pension Office.

That he owns property, real and personal, of the value of 70 dollars, and no more; that he has no means of self-support other than the above named; that his trade or occupation is that of a Farmer.

That he has <sup>(\*)</sup> 2 wife; that he has 1 children now living; ages, respectively <sup>(2)</sup> 11 years. That his postoffice address is Quincy, State of Illinois; that his nearest railway station is Quincy on the B. & O. Railway, in Adams County in said State; that the name and address of the person, to whom he desires notice of his illness or death shall be given, is Ardella Ma Thew of 637 Walnut St Quincy County of Adams, State of Ill; that, in case of his death, he desires all his personal effects to be sent to same party at Quincy County of Adams State of Ill.

That he has not heretofore been a member of any Soldiers', Sailors', or other Charitable Home or Institution, excepting the <sup>(6)</sup> Illinois Soldiers and Sailors Home.

That he is now a bona fide resident of the State of Illinois, and has continuously lived and resided in said State for the last two years, or has served in an Illinois organization.

That he is so far disabled by <sup>(7)</sup> U. S. W. hand and arm as to now be incapable of earning his own living.

That he has at all times, heretofore, supported and adhered to the government of the United States of America, and that he has not at any time been engaged in, or countenanced, or aided, or abetted, the cause of the late Rebellion.

That if he shall be admitted to be a member of the said Home, he will in all things stand in every respect, comply with and conform to the rules and regulations made, or that shall hereafter be made, for the government and discipline of the same; and that he will cheerfully do and perform any and all things that shall be required of him by those there in authority over him; and that he will promptly, and willingly, obey all lawful orders that he shall receive from any officer of the Home, so long as he shall remain a member thereof.

ILLINOIS SOLDIERS' AND SAILORS' HOME, QUINCY, ILL.

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN.

I, William Mathews of Illinois Soldiers' and Sailors' Home in the County of Adams and State of Illinois, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do, therefore, make, ordain, publish and declare, this to be my last, Will and Testament.

First. I order and direct that my Executor hereafter named, pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon after my decease as conveniently may be.

Second. After the payment of such funeral expenses and debts, I give, devise and bequeath all worldly goods of which I may die possessed,

to the Illinois Soldiers and Sailors Home to be sent to Cordella Mathews 634 Walnut Street Quincy Illinois

Lastly, I make, constitute and appoint Capt. Wm Somerville Supt. or his Successors in office to be Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
